Seventh Sunday of Easter

Welcome to you all. This Sunday, the readings tell us that God knows our hearts and wants us to belong to him, not to the world. The second reading tells us to be united with God in love. And in the gospel Jesus prays for his disciples, that they be kept safe and be consecrated to the Good News. So, this week's focus can be on commitment, rejecting evil, and living lives of service. Pilate at the trial of Jesus asked, 'Truth? What is that?'. Today, Christ, who calls Himself the truth, prays that we may be kept true to the Father's name. He asks that we may be consecrated in the truth. He does this because He is sending us out to bear witness in the world to God's truth. The sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation empower us to be courageous witnesses for Christ, by adhering to the truth and embracing the graces of faith, hope, and love. The truth is not always welcomed, look at the trial of Jesus, but the truth is true whether everyone or no one believes it. In this age of 'relative truth' absolutes are often rejected. Yet it is the Holy Spirit, leading us into all truth, that empowers the apostles and us to witness to the truth.

This Sunday is World Communications Day, the Pope's message follows the theme Artificial Intelligence and the Wisdom of the Heart: Towards a Fully Human Communication. With the growth of AI and social media we can often be left asking 'Truth, What is that?'. If you would like to read more there are copies at the back of Church for you to take.

Jesus raised his eyes to heaven and said: 'Holy Father, keep those you have given me true to your name, so that they may be one like us. While I was with them, I kept those you had given me true to your name. I have watched over them and not one is lost except the one who chose to be lost, and this was to fulfil the scriptures. But now I am coming to you and while still in the world I say these things to share my joy with them to the full. I passed your word on to them, and the world hated them, because they belong to the world no more than I belong to the world. I am not asking you to remove them from the world, but to protect them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world. Consecrate them in the truth; your word is truth. As you sent me into the world, I have sent them into the world, and for their sake I consecrate myself so that they too may be consecrated in truth.'

2nd Collection this Week

This week there will is a second collection for Catholic Communications. Celebrated on Sunday 12 May, this year's theme is closely linked to the Pope's message for the World Day of Peace, which was devoted to the development of systems of artificial intelligence (AI). Al is "radically affecting the world of information and communication, and through it, certain foundations of life in society," says the Pope in his Communications Day message, adding that "these changes affect everyone." So, the Pope asks, "how can we remain fully human and guide this cultural transformation to serve a good purpose?"
